The Off Campus Integrated Learning Experience (OCILE) program offers students positive integrated opportunities for learning which enhance his/her awareness, acceptance, and appreciation of cultural diversity. This is a unique and valuable opportunity for your child to participate in the Balboa Park Program.

The children will be transported by bus from their school of attendance to the Balboa Park Program site. Upon arrival they will be organized into small, integrated groups and assigned to a qualified staff member who will assist them in various educational experiences. These experiences will include visits to such places as the San Diego Zoo, Aerospace Museum, Natural History Museum, Reuben H. Fleet Science Center, the Museum of Man, Hall of Champions, World Beat Center, and other places of educational interest.

Hours/Days:

Program hours are from 9:40 AM to 3:45 PM, Monday through Friday, except for school holidays.

There are no half days or minimum days for students.

Transportation:

Morning Bus Service

- Children should report for school each morning at the time designated by their school principal.

Afternoon Bus Service:

At the end of the school day, students will be returned to their school of attendance with the following exceptions:

- Magnet students may choose to be delivered to one of the following elementary schools: school of attendance, neighborhood school, or the school based on the student's bus service address.
- VEEP and Capacity students will be delivered to their neighborhood school within the feeder pattern.
- Special Education students will be delivered to their regular afternoon bus stop.
- Buses will arrive at students' neighborhood school by 4:30 PM, depending on transportation routes.

Parent Pickup:

- Please telephone the Balboa Park Program office at (619) 293-4459.
- Send a note with your child to give to the Balboa Park Office.
- Be prepared to show photo identification at the time of pickup. Students must be picked up by 3:15 PM.
- If you have arranged to transport someone else's child, that child's parent/guardian must provide verbal and written permission.

Parent Visits:

- Parents/Guardians are encouraged to visit the program.
- Contact the Balboa Park office at (619) 293-4459 at least 48 hours in advance to arrange your visit.
- Visitors are expected to abide by the same guidelines as the students and staff.
- Due to liability issues, family and friends who are under the age of 18 cannot be accommodated.

4. Food:

- Lunch and milk is provided at no cost to the student.
- You may send a nutritious lunch from home.
 - Please pack the lunch in a brown paper or plastic bag, as to be fully disposable; please no lunch pails, backpacks, plastic or glass containers.
 - Write your child's name and school clearly on the outside of the bag.
 - A balanced meal is encouraged for students.
 - Please do not send soda, gum, or candy.
- Identify any food allergies on the PERMISSION AND MEDICAL AUTHORIZATION FORM.
- No water bottles, thermoses or containers. Carrying water into museums is not permitted.

5. Dress:

- Shoes:- Closed toe, closed heel, comfortable walking shoes are required. Socks are suggested.
 - No sandals, hee-lies, or flip-flops are allowed.
- Shorts:- Should be of adequate length, as students will be sitting on grass, ground, and classroom/museum floors.
 - No short-shorts or mini-skirts.
- Shirts:- Shirts should adequately cover shoulders and midriffs as weather conditions vary throughout the day.
 - No spaghetti strap tops, bare midriff shirts, or tank tops.
- Miscellaneous: Hats, sunglasses, and umbrellas are allowed, as necessary.

6. Medications:

Please complete the attached PERMISSION AND MEDICAL AUTHORIZATION FORM

- Identify and describe your child's medical condition.
- Describe how your child's medical condition might impact the quality of his/her Balboa Park experience.
- Describe any accommodations your child might need (wheel chairs, adult assistance/aide, frequent bathroom breaks, asthma, food allergies, environmental allergies, animal allergies, etc.).
- Identify any medications your child requires while at the program. A copy of the *Physicians Recommendation For Medication* form will need to accompany medications.
- Medications should be given to your child's school office staff. All medications will be sent to the Balboa Park Program office.
- Children are not permitted to carry medications of any kind, unless cleared by the Balboa Park Program Nurse.

7. What Not To Bring To School:

- Money, candy, gum, toys
- Backpacks, fanny packs, purses, water bottles, non-disposable lunch containers
- Cell phones are allowed, but students are only allowed to use them before and/or after school.
- Cameras are only allowed on Fridays. One-time cameras are suggested.
 - Make sure your child has film and batteries, students will not have the opportunity to purchase supplies.
 - The Balboa Park Program is not liable for any student possessions.

Morning Service:

Students currently receiving school bus transportation will ride their regular bus to school. Participating students will then be transported from their school of attendance to the Balboa Park Program site at 3366 ½ Zoo Drive, San Diego, CA 92103.

Afternoon Service:

Students will be returned to their school of attendance with the following exceptions:

Magnet students may choose to be delivered to one of the following elementary schools:

- School of attendance
- Resident (neighborhood) elementary school

VEEP and Capacity students will be delivered to their resident (neighborhood) elementary school, within the VEEP/Capacity feeder pattern.

Special Education students will be delivered to their regular afternoon bus stop.

Note: All students have the option of being returned to their school of attendance. However, transportation home once the child is dropped off becomes the responsibility of the parent.

Buses will ordinarily arrive at the school by 4:30 p.m., although it may be earlier or later depending on transportation routes. Parents should be sure their child knows the way home from their drop-off point or make plans to have someone meet them and take them home.

If you must pick up your child from the Balboa Park Program site, please telephone the program office at (619) 293-4459 a day in advance, and send a note with contact information with your child the morning of pick up.

The school your child attends is responsible for submitting the drop-off information. If the school site does not notify the Transportation Department, the student will be delivered to the elementary school listed as the bus service address.

During the week at the Balboa Park program, there are no half days. The transportation schedule remains the same for the entire week.
