Recommendations:

1. The separation of Gompers Secondary School into geographically distinct middle school and high school programs for the 2004-05 school year, as detailed in this report.
2. Facility modifications and budget allocations to support this separation, as detailed in this report.

Summary of Previous Board of Education Discussion and Action:

The transition of Gompers from a 7-12 secondary school to a 6-8 middle school feeding to Lincoln has been an element of the planning for Lincoln since the development of the Proposition MM program, and was included in the Proposition MM ballot language.

Summary of Key Issue(s):

- District staff and the Lincoln/Gompers Redevelopment Committee (LGRC) collaboratively developed a set of transition options for Gompers subject to the program improvement requirements of No Child Left Behind, until Lincoln reopens in the 2006-07 school year and Gompers becomes the primary feeder middle school to Lincoln.
- The Gompers community overwhelmingly supports an option that divides Gompers into distinct middle school and high school programs to commence this transition. This option was unanimously recommended by the Lincoln/Gompers Redevelopment Committee.

Fiscal Analysis:

Execution of the facilities modifications on the Gompers east campus to support a largely self-contained high school program has a cost estimate of \$1.2 million. This action will be supported by the 2A (State School Facilities Program) budget.
