

EXPLANATION OF RATIFICATION OF FIRST AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT  
BETWEEN  
SAN DIEGO UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT  
AND  
SAN DIEGO STATE UNIVERSITY

September 14, 2004

- PARTIES TO THE AGREEMENT: San Diego Unified School District (District) and San Diego State University (University)
- AGREEMENT SUMMARY: The District will provide supervised teaching experience in selected District schools to University students attempting to secure California teaching credentials.
- TERM: September 1, 2003 to June 30, 2004
- AMOUNT OF FUNDING: Amendment increases the original Agreement by \$5,825.00, for a total not to exceed \$66,500.00.
- SOURCE OF FUNDING: San Diego State University (University pays the District, District pays supervising teachers)
- BACKGROUND INFORMATION: Initial certification of prospective teachers normally involves the successful completion of a student teaching assignment. To complete this requirement, it is necessary that assignments be available within District schools so that the prospective teachers may demonstrate their potential for receiving certification. University personnel as well as an assigned supervising (District) teacher at the school where the student teaching occurs supervise student teachers.

**Rationale for Ratification:** The District has been working with SDSU over the past two years to revise the Student Teaching Agreement process so that Agreements and/or Amendments are Board approved prior to their start dates. The attached Amendment was sent to the District under a cover letter dated July 1, 2004. The Amendment arrived in our office on July 14, 2004, after the deadline to submit agenda items for the July 27, 2004 Board meeting. We received no prior information from the University that an Amendment was needed. We will continue to work with the University to resolve these contracting issues.
