

EXPLANATION OF AGREEMENT  
BETWEEN THE  
SAN DIEGO UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT  
AND THE  
CITY OF SAN DIEGO

August 9, 2005

PARTIES TO THE AGREEMENT: San Diego Unified School District (District) and the City of San Diego (City)

AGREEMENT SUMMARY: The District and City agree to work cooperatively to continue operating San Diego's "6 to 6" Extended School Day programs at 126 school sites during the 2005-2006 school year. The City agrees to provide program management, monitoring, and assessment, and to subcontract with community-based organizations to provide program services and enrichment activities. The District agrees to design the academic component of the program and provide school facilities, snacks, and custodial services.

TERM: September 1, 2005 through June 30, 2006

AMOUNT OF FUNDING: Not to Exceed \$13,764,663 (from District to City)

SOURCE OF FUNDING: After School Education and Safety Program (ASESP) grant funds not to exceed \$11,464,324 and 21<sup>st</sup> Century Learning Center (21<sup>st</sup> CCLC) grant funds not to exceed \$2,300,338. The San Diego County Office of Education (SDCOE) provides ASES and 21<sup>st</sup> CCLC grant funds to the District specifically for this purpose.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: San Diego's "6 to 6" Extended School Day programs began in 1998 in partnership with the District, the SDCOE, the City of San Diego, and non-profit community-based organizations (e.g., Harmonium, San Diego Reads, Social Advocates for Youth, and the YMCA). The "6 to 6" programs offer elementary and middle school students a safe before- and after-school environment. Program activities include 60-90 minutes of academic instruction, homework assistance, and tutorial support, followed by enrichment activities such as arts and crafts, theatre, and sports.
