Description

Lincoln High operates as four centers under unified purview. The centers are a result of a bold effort to remedy a serious student achievement problem

When Lincoln closed in 2003, fewer than 25 percent attained proficient or advanced levels in all CST categories. More than 50 percent of African-American and Latino students were credit-deficient at the end of 9th grade, resulting in a higher dropout risk/rate.

Re-opening in 2007, our four centers have a single vision: to enable students to gain the knowledge and skills to succeed at Lincoln, in college and in the workplace. The Center for Public Safety gives students with an interest in fire, rescue, emergency response and law enforcement the opportunity to learn from educator-experts in the field. The Center for Science and Engineering opens students' minds to engineering, architecture, biotechnology and medicine. The Center for the Arts enables

students to participate in enriching VAPA classes such as dance, choral, drama, drawing/painting, ceramics, digital media/design, technical theater, orchestra and band. The 9th Grade Center for Social Justice is designed to facilitate a successful transition to high school, increasing the number of 9th-graders who move to 10th grade with credits completed as they explore and learn to address social justice issues.

All Lincoln students participate in a rigorous curriculum. They enjoy relevant classroom experiences as they collaborate with peers, business partners and community members.

During 2007-08, baseline data has been established in pursuit of measurable student achievement goals for 2011-12. These include a decreased dropout rate and increased attendance rates, grades, credit completion, standardized test achievements and four-year graduation rates.
