Interior work begins on new building at Point Loma High School



SAN DIEGO – A new, two-story classroom building is more than 50 percent complete at Point Loma High School. The 19,000-square-foot building, with steel frame and masonry walls, includes 10 general classrooms and two science labs.

The general contractor is **Soltek Pacific**, the masonry subcontractor is **Modern Masonry**, and the steel subcontractor is **Richardson Steel**. **Zagrodnik + Thomas** provided architectural services. From the school district, **Dave Strandberg** is the construction manager, **Lance Lareau** is the project manager and **Jed Griffith** and **Ron Lintz** are the project inspectors.

The project began in April 2002 and should be completed in Fall 2003. Other modernization work at Point Loma High School includes science classrooms renovations, a new lunch court shelter, technology upgrades, a new three-level elevator, and aesthetic and functional repairs, such as painting, flooring, landscaping and parking.

The projects are funded by Proposition MM, a 1998 bond measure that provides \$1.51 billion toward the \$4 billion of needed modernization and expansion projects at San Diego City Schools.
