ELIGIBILITY

- **Members¹ of SDCAEA can submit their students' work (K-12)**
- **San Diego County Special Education, learning disabled students only.**
- **The theme of the exhibition is “Visions.”** Each child has their own interpretation of life, the world, goals, aspirations and their own story to tell. This is an opportunity for students to voice their “vision” through creative expression and have their voices be heard. Please have students create a work of art that tells a story either about their own lives, thoughts about the future, or from their imagination.
- A maximum of **8** (2-D) or (3-D) works may be submitted from each school.
- Small sculptural pieces only, no installations or electronic pieces will be accepted.
- Maximum size for 2-D art is **24”x 30” including BLACK mat.** Only Black mats please...(construction paper and tag board mats will not be accepted). No framed art.
- **All student art must be original work** and not copied from any published material, such as magazines, calendars and art texts or art prints.

LABELING

- Make copies of the entry label and paste it to the **BACK** of each piece of art.
- Type an inventory sheet** and make three copies - spelling is important.
- Attach one inventory sheet to your reusable portfolio of entries.
- Place the second inventory sheet inside the portfolio.
- Keep one inventory sheet for your records.
- **SDAI will type their own labels** for the show using the information on your inventory sheet.

INVENTORY SHEET**

- Should be typed and include: A heading with the school name, address, teacher name and contact information...phone at school, phone at home, and better yet, your email address.
- And then a list of entries: Category - Name - Title – Medium - School – Teacher
