Mathematics Specialist Certificate Program 2007

The San Diego State University Elementary Mathematics Specialist Certificate Program is a two-year program designed specifically for elementary school teachers. We have two programs: one is designed for teachers in the primary grades and the other is designed for teachers in the upper elementary grades. The focus is on helping teachers acquire a deep understanding of the mathematics they teach and the skills needed to teach that mathematics effectively. Each program consists of 12 units of coursework in mathematics and pedagogy geared to the particular grade levels.

Program participants take 6 units of graduate-level Mathematics Education classes and 6 units of Mathematics classes. All courses are offered at **reduced tuition rates**, and are held at Mt. Everest Academy in the Clairemont Mesa area between interstates 5 and 805, with one week of summer classes held on the SDSU campus each year.

We plan to start Primary Cohorts (K-2nd grade) and Upper Elementary Cohorts (3rd – 6th grade) in summer of 2007.
