In this course students will learn to apply processes and skills in acting, directing, and designing, to create formal and informal theatre. Students of this course will be able to take what they learn and apply it to teach their elementary school students the theatrical skills of acting. Activities include theatre games, warm-ups, relaxation exercises, improvises, and skits which serve to aid the internalization of the skills covered. Elementary school teachers are especially encouraged to take this course which will put them in the shoes of the grade school student and enable them to learn some acting skills.

This is an introductory course in garden/landscape design. Course participants will have the opportunity to design their own properties or begin implementing a garden project at their school sites. Participants will visit a nursery, draw a design using 1/4" scale, and begin developing ideas of how to teach these concepts to their students. A second phase will be offered in the spring to further develop classroom lessons using design concepts.

This course is designed to guide high school teachers in planning and implementing the research process with their students and utilizing the databases for instructional purposes.
