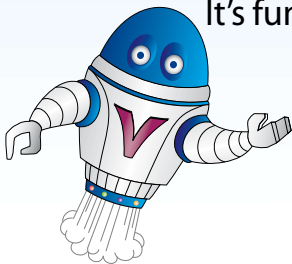

ON WORLD MATH DAY 2009, ALL STUDENTS WILL COMPETE ON WWW.WORLDMATHDAY.COM.

WHO: All third- through eighth-grade students can participate in World Math Day.

WHAT: World Math Day is an international event where students from around the world participate online in real-time battles of speed and skill by correctly answering as many math questions as possible in one day.

WHEN: March 4, 2009. As an international event, World Math Day 2009 will take place while it is March 4th anywhere in the world.

**Question: The World Math Day site will go LIVE worldwide on March 4th at 12:01 a.m. Auckland, New Zealand time. The time zone in Auckland can be represented as UTC/GMT + 13 hours. The Central Standard Time (CST) zone in the US is represented as UTC/GMT – 6 hours. At what time will US students in the CST zone be able to begin competing in World Math Day? (See answer below.)*

WHERE: Students can compete anywhere, on any computer with Internet access by logging on to www.worldmathday.com and entering their username and password.

WHY: It's **FUN**, **FRIENDLY**, and **FREE!** World Math Day makes math **FUN** and generates excitement about math. The **FRIENDLY**, competitive nature builds student confidence and camaraderie, and the international aspect generates curiosity and interest. More than 1.5 million students in 165 countries are expected to take part! And the best part – **IT'S FREE!**

HOW: Registration is open from February 1, 2009 through March 1, 2009. As soon as students are registered and receive their username and password, they can go online and practice for World Math Day.
