This comprehensive healthcare provider course covers Adult, Child, and Infant CPR and techniques for clearing obstructed airway and the use of a defibrillation machine. The course will also cover basic First Aid techniques. It is taught according to the American Heart Association guidelines and meets the requirements for the professional clear health education CPR, B-level credential certificate (the course includes both B and C level CPR). Upon completion, you will receive a two year certification card approved by the American Heart Association.

June 30 - July 14, Tu.-Th. 2.53 Functional Spanish for K-12 Teachers, Administrators, & Staff- A Guide for Communicating with Students & Their Families, Part I (1 cr.)

July 24, Fr.	27.4	How String Changed the World: An Exploration of Fiber and Material Culture at Mingei International Museum (.5 cr.)

Traces of ancient weaving pressed into clay show that fiber was an integral part of human life 27,000 years ago. In a hands-on workshop use the scientific principles of inquiry, investigation and experimentation to explore why humans first twisted fibers into thread and how this discovery revolutionized early cultures. Ply your own string and make your own cloth the way our ancestors did, while learning how plant and animal fibers evolved in the ancient world. Investigate how textiles reflect their society's "material culture" from strictly utilitarian string to exquisite expressions of adornment, and thus gain an understanding of the historical and cultural context of textiles within past and present cultures throughout the world. Explore the material culture of India as displayed in the exhibit "India Adorned" and create an embellished textile that reflects your personal perception of and response to the exhibit. The post-workshop assignment will include the creation and implementation of an art and science integrated lesson plan - using the textile arts as a vehicle for inquiry, investigation and experimentation - as well as a follow-up reflection on the implementation of this lesson plan.
