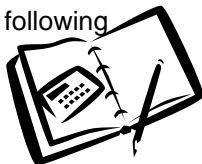

## STUDENT PLANNER

Good organization and study habits established now will help students achieve their goals in the future. Each student will receive a student planner in which they are expected to record daily assignments, homework, upcoming tests, projects, etc. Students will purchase the planner from their English teacher. Cost is \$4.00. Lost planners must be replaced. They are available in the Finance Office for \$5.00.

We are asking that each student have the following items and bring them to school each day:

- 1 ½" metal three-ring binder
- Dividers for each subject
- 1 pen/pencil plastic pouch to fit the binder
- 8 ½ X 11 notebook paper punched for the binder
- Personal reading book: students will read at least 25 books per year to meet District & State Language Arts Standards.

**Check out our website. You will be able to contact teachers and learn about all the exciting things going on at Wangenheim Middle School. You can also keep informed about your child's information on Parent Connection. A Parent Connection account allows you to look at information such as grades, attendance and homework. More information will be sent home in the Opening of School Envelope in September.**

## DRESS CODE

The dress code is in effect any time students are on campus **24 hours a day**, including after school and evening events. All clothing and footwear is to be safe and appropriate to a school setting.

- No hats, headwear or sunglasses
- Sun protection hats are Wangenheim hats only and are available for purchase.
- Undergarments cannot be visible.
- Students must wear at least one shirt (not including jackets or sweaters) with shoulder straps 3" or wider.
- Skirts and shorts must come down to around the knee area. No short shorts or skirts
- Students may not wear tube or halter tops, spaghetti straps, off the shoulder, backless, mesh, midriff, crop or cut-out shirts, including "muscle" undershirts.
- Items which denote gang affiliation, crime, profanity, weapons, alcoholic, or illegal substances are not allowed.
- Clothing cannot be ripped, shredded, or cut.
- Spikes, chains, or safety pins are not allowed.
- The P.E. uniform may only be worn during P.E. class.
- Slippers, pajamas, or flip-flops are not allowed.
- No hoods on while inside.

Students who dress inappropriately will be asked to change, to have parents come with a change of clothes, or be sent home. Inappropriate clothing will be confiscated. If item is not picked up within one week by a parent or student with parent signature, it will be donated to charity.

## INAPPROPRIATE ITEMS

Possession or use of items inappropriate to the educational process, such as poppers, CD players, iPods, PSP's, laser pointers, tape recorders, video games, cameras, skateboards, rollerblades, scooters, toys, spray cans, permanent markers, liquid white-out, and trading cards are not allowed at school.

First Offense: the item will be returned to the student after the parent signs a warning.

Second Offense: the item will only be returned to the parent.

Items not retrieved within one week will be discarded. Items for repeat offenders may be confiscated until the end of the school year. Wangenheim is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged items.

## ATTENDANCE INFORMATION

Student Information Cards will be sent home on the first day of school and must be returned within one week. The state and district require that we have a new set of information cards each school year. This is your opportunity to update phone numbers and inform us to whom we may or may not release your child in case of emergency or early release. The information you provide will be updated in our computer system. In addition, this is a good time to discuss with your child your family's plan in case of emergency. Please make sure your child memorizes and has a copy of important phone numbers.

**Please call the school whenever your child is absent.** All absences must be verified with a parent/guardian through personal contact, note, or telephone call. If a parent/guardian has not contacted the school regarding his/her child's absence within five days of absence, the school will consider the student's absence to be unexcused. If your child must leave early, please send the student to the Attendance Office (**not the teacher**) with a note or call the office in the morning. Please allow time for us to send for the student. If students are suited up for P.E., it can take up to 20 minutes or more for them to change and walk to the office.

Our Automated Dialing System will call your home number between 5:00 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. each day to verify absences and tardies when parents have not notified the office.

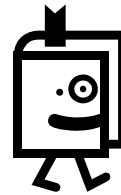
## MEDIA CENTER NEWS

The library is a favorite place for kids to visit during the school day. I look forward to sharing my love of reading and research with students while supporting the teachers and the curriculum.

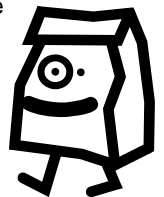
**Textbook Checkout** will be during the first month of school. Individual textbooks are available for some courses. Students will keep these textbooks at home during the school year. Each textbook should be covered



and kept in a safe, dry place. Please be aware that your student checks out books with a specific number and the books with these same numbers must be returned in good condition at the end of the school year. Each student is responsible for returning the same textbooks we checked out to him/her, so please be careful not to mix those books with textbooks belonging to other students. Textbooks are very expensive with most core subject books costing over \$50. **Library Books:** Students may check out up to 5 books at a time. Each book is checked out for 2 weeks. If books are overdue, there is a fine of 5 cents a day for each overdue book. If a student needs to keep a book for longer than 2 weeks, he/she may renew (recheck) the book. **Computer Catalog:** Computer Catalogs are available in the library for students to look for books. Students may also access the computer catalog at home. The Computer Catalog is a web-based search program that allows patrons to search for books and other instructional materials. ## LUNCH

The lunch period lasts 30 minutes and students must remain on campus. Students will go to lunch at the same time as their 4<sup>th</sup> period teacher. The Tiger Eatery sells complete lunches for **\$2.50** and a large variety of a la carte items and drinks. Students are permitted to eat only in the designated lunch area. Breakfast is \$1.00 and is served from 7:15 a.m. to 7:40 a.m.



Students are encouraged to **bring sack lunches for the first two weeks.** Long lines are possible while students are becoming familiar with the menu and trying to remember new pin numbers. An application for the free lunch program will be sent home with your child on the first day of school. If you qualify, you may complete the application and return it to school.

## PHYSICAL EDUCATION DEPARTMENT

The development and maintenance of physical fitness is an integral part of our curriculum. The following information provides a basis for our physical education program.

### **GOALS OF THE PHYSICALLY EDUCATED STUDENT:**

- To learn skills necessary to perform a variety of physical activities
- To be physically fit
- To participate regularly in daily physical activity
- To know the implications of and benefits from involvement in physical activities
- To value physical activity and its contributions to a healthy lifestyle

### **PROGRAM:**

The 6<sup>th</sup> grade program will focus on:

- Individual and cooperative games that develop throwing, striking and movement patterns relating to skills
- Recognizing the importance of social interaction in a variety of activities and beginning to develop lifetime knowledge and interest in physical activity.

The 7<sup>th</sup> grade course will:

- Continue to practice throwing, striking, and movement patterns relating to individual skills
- Recognize the importance of social interaction in a variety of activities
- Identify principles of training and conditioning
- Develop lifelong knowledge and interest in physical activity. Students participate in team games.

The 8<sup>th</sup> grade course includes emphasis on:

- Fitness
- Advanced skills, techniques and strategies in team sports.

The typical class period consists of recording attendance, uniform checks, warm-ups, instructional time (lecture, demonstration, drills) and/or participation in an activity. Activities may include: games, skill drills, basketball, football (flag), volleyball, volley tennis, team handball, fitness activities, rope jumping, aerobics, track and field, disk throwing/spinning, rhythms, softball, hockey, volleyball and racquetball.

Students are required to dress daily for P. E. class. **Students excused by a PE teacher or parent from an activity due to sudden illness are still required to dress for class. If a student needs to be excused for more than three days because of injury or illness, a doctor's note must be sent to the nurse before school.**

**UNIFORM:** The physical education uniform consists of the following: **Required:** 1 Wangenheim PE shirt- \$10.00; 1 Pair of Wangenheim gym shorts- \$12.00; 1 pair of athletic socks; 1 pair of tied-athletic shoes. **Highly Recommended:** Wangenheim Sweatshirt-\$13.00; Wangenheim Sweatpants-\$13.00. **Teachers prefer to label the student's uniform.** Students should label their PE socks and shoes. The PTSA will be selling uniforms and a Wangenheim baseball cap for protection from the sun at Orientation and throughout the year. No other hat may be worn at school.

For safety reasons the PE Dept. **does not** allow the following:

- Wearing leggings, sagging shorts, extra shorts and a shirt, a sweatshirt with a zipper, hood, or pockets. Coats are not allowed.
- Wearing slip-on shoes or slip-on gym shoes. These do not provide enough support for the foot in strenuous activities.
- Wearing tied athletic shoes with the laces tied under the tongue of the shoe and/or a sock placed under the shoe tongue.
- Sharing PE clothes with another student and/or sharing a PE basket.

Failure to suit up and/or participate in class may result in consequences and will effect both scholarship and citizenship grades. If a student has two (2) days of not suiting for PE, the highest grade they can earn is a "B". The following specifies the grade that can be earned if a student is a "Non-suit" for PE class. 2 NS = B; 3 NS=C; 4 NS=D. (NS =Non-suit)

**LOCKS:** For the PE locker room, combination/keyed locks must be purchased from the Wangenheim office. Each lock is registered by serial number, name, and basket number and may be used each year the student is enrolled at Wangenheim and may be passed on to a sibling. **A lock costs \$5.00.** This type of lock improves security, reduces theft and aids a student who has forgotten the combination. Only PE teachers and the principal have the keys to access the locks. A student must replace any lock that is lost at his or her own expense. Locks not purchased from the school will be removed. A student without a lock must carry his/her PE clothes daily in his/her backpack.

**Security Recommendations for using locks:** Rest assured that it is close to impossible for the school locks to be broken or "kicked off". To reduce theft and loss of belongings please speak with your child about the need to:

- \*Memorize his/her lock combination without sharing it with friends.
- \*Not share his/her lock or basket with others.
- \*Not to take short cuts by setting the lock to the last number of the combination. Gravity or another student may bump or tug it open gaining access to your child's belongings.
- \*All valuables must be locked. Cell phones and money should be taken out of the backpack and locked into the PE baskets while the student is attending P.E. class.

**General Grading Policy:**

**Scholarship:** Participation, Skills, Knowledge, and Improvement.

**Citizenship:** Participation, Responsibility (uniform, equipment, etc.) Tardiness, Behavior and Conduct (class and locker room).



## HOMWORK

Homework will be assigned on a regular basis. Homework helps students become self-directed, independent learners, and improves their academic achievement.

The amount of homework may vary, but all students are responsible for completing homework. In all classes, students should consider that any unfinished work automatically becomes homework. Each teacher sends home his/her individual late work and homework policies in the syllabus at the beginning of the year and they are also posted on our website. All policies have been reviewed and approved by Mr. Grano and have his full support. Your child is responsible for recording assignments on the homework calendar, which you may then check. Don't forget, every student has a homework partner for each period as a double check. Parents can also see assignments on Parent Connection.



## LIVE HOMEWORK HELP

Use your Library Card to get help online. Live Homework Help is a free, live, one-to-one online tutoring service connecting students in the SDUSD to qualified tutors from any Internet-enabled computer. Students, parents, and teachers can connect to online tutors seven days a week between 1:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. Currently the service is only accessible on computers from home running Microsoft Windows.

To use Live Homework Help and connect with a live online tutor, you need either a valid San Diego Public Library Card Number and Personal Identification Number (PIN) or a San Diego Public Library Access card. To assist you in completing a Library Card Application you may download the application by visiting [www.sandiego.gov/public-library/](http://www.sandiego.gov/public-library/). Select "I Want To apply for a library card" on the upper-left side of the screen.

To access Live Homework Help, visit [www.sandiego.gov/public-library/](http://www.sandiego.gov/public-library/). Choose Live Homework Help from right side of screen.

## COUNSELING OFFICE

If a student wishes to talk to a counselor, he/she must fill out the "Request To See Counselor" form.

These forms are located on the counter directly inside the Counseling Office. **ALL STUDENTS MUST SIGN IN WHEN VISITING THE COUNSELING OFFICE AND WILL NOT BE ADMITTED DURING SCHOOL HOURS WITHOUT A PASS.** If parents or guardians would like to meet with their child's counselor, they should call and schedule an appointment.

## STUDENT ACTIVITIES AND THE ASSOCIATED STUDENT BODY (A.S.B.)

A great deal of emphasis is placed on student activities at Wangenheim Middle School. We encourage all of our students to become involved in the activities that are offered. We believe that students who participate in activities can more closely identify with the school and develop a feeling of pride and loyalty. Many student activities will be scheduled during lunch periods. The purpose of the A.S.B. is to promote the welfare of the school, encourage loyalty and school spirit, and to develop leadership. **Every student is a member of the Associated Student Body.**

## HEALTH OFFICE

The health office is open to students, parents and staff from 7:30 am until 2:45 pm on regular school days. Please contact the Registered Nurse if your student needs to take prescription medication during the school day. Asthma inhalers are considered a prescription item and the student's doctor needs to complete a school district form for the student to carry the inhaler. Please have a parent/guardian bring the completed form to the school nurse. New forms are needed each school year. Items left in the health office at the end of the school year are discarded if not picked up by the parent/guardian.

Over the counter medications such as Acetaminophen (Tylenol), Ibuprophen (Motrin), and Advil are available in the health office on an as needed basis when a Registered Nurse is present. No other staff can administer these medications. If your student needs to take over the counter medication on a daily basis, then a physician's recommendation form needs to be completed, given to the registered nurse, and a supply of the medication brought to the school. The school nurse can then arrange for other staff to give the medication for the physician indicated purpose only.

Short term medications (such as antibiotics) may be given by the school staff if the orders from the physician are on the label and the medication must be given more than four times per twenty-four hours. If the medication is ordered three times per day or less, it is possible and safer to give the medication at home.

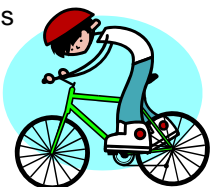
## CELL PHONE POLICY

Students may have a cell phone on campus. However, **cell phones may only be used outside before and after school.** They may NOT be used between the hours of 7:45 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. During school hours, they may not ring, vibrate or be seen. Any staff member who hears a cell phone ring or sees it may confiscate it. Students who text during school will receive additional consequences. Wangenheim is not responsible for phones that are lost, stolen or damaged at school.

## SAFETY

**Campus Security**....In order to keep our school secure, San Diego Unified School District has asked that all schools keep their campuses safe by locking all gates. Anyone wishing to visit campus must enter through the front office and sign in.

**Bicycle Security**....Wangenheim takes every precaution to provide security in the bicycle rack, however students park their bicycles at their own risk. The school is not responsible for damage to or theft of bicycles. Students who ride a bicycle to school must have a secure lock with which to lock the bicycle to a rack in the bicycle rack. In addition, state law requires students to wear helmets when riding their bicycles. Students are expected to walk their bikes in front of the school and on campus. It is strongly recommended that all bicycles ridden to school be registered and/or licensed. **NO SKATEBOARDS, ROLLERBLADES, WHEELIES OR RAZER SCOOTERS** are allowed on campus. The bike racks are locked from 7:45 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.



## PROCEDURE FOR STUDENT PICK UP AND DROP OFF...

Please arrange a meeting spot **OFF CAMPUS** to pickup and drop off your child. Parents are not allowed to drive into the parking lot to pick up or drop off students during the morning and afternoon rush hours.

You may drive into the parking lot and park under the following circumstances only:

- You have an appointment or need to go into the office.
- Your child has a medical condition which has been brought to the attention of the school nurse and the school nurse agrees that your child should not walk in from the street.
- Your child has a very heavy project to bring to school.
- It is not between 7:15 and 7:45 a.m. or 2:15 to 2:45 p.m.

**When dropping off your child, please do not allow your child to:**

- **get out of the car in the middle of the street**
- **get out of the car in the middle of the crosswalk**
- **get out of the car while the car is in a red zone.**

We are trying to avoid traffic accidents, traffic citations, and most important, injury to any of our Wangenheim students. The red zones and crosswalks are marked specifically for students' safety. It is **illegal** to park the car next to a red curb, in a crosswalk, or to release passengers from the middle of the street. The streets are very congested and we need to keep the cars out of these areas to prevent an accident. It is much less congested one half a block away from the main entrance to school, and we recommend that you drop off and pick up your child in a less congested area.

Please ensure that anyone transporting your child complies with the parking and driving laws that are designed for your child's safety. By arranging to drop your child off in a safe and legal location, you will be teaching your child important safety rules that may prevent an accident or injury.

## PARENTCONNECTION

Communication between schools and parents is important to improve student achievement in the classroom. In an effort to build on this belief and to ensure academic success for all students, we have implemented ParentConnection. ParentConnection can provide parents with another way of connecting with their child's education. By using ParentConnection, parents are able to view educational information about their children.

ParentConnection is a web-based application that allows parents secured access to academic information about their children from home. Information that can be accessed includes attendance, behavior, GPA data, report cards/progress report grades, and student schedule.

ParentConnection requires a computer with Internet access and a web browser such as Internet Explorer. ParentConnection will work on a computer running either Windows or Macintosh OS. If you do not have a computer in your home, computers at public libraries have Internet connections and can be used for free.

As a security measure, to protect the privacy of student information, parents are required to register to use ParentConnection. **You do not need to re-register if you already have a ParentConnection account from Wangenheim Middle School.**

## Wildcat Way Character Education Program

We encourage all students to work towards earning a **Leadership, Character, and Service Award**. This award is part of our Wildcat Way character education program. The purpose of the award is to encourage all students to develop leadership skills, strengthen important character traits, and begin a life-long tradition of community service. The award is designed so that all Wangenheim students can earn it if they put in the effort. Our goal is to have as many students as possible earn the award.

Each grade level has a certain number of points which the students must earn to receive the award. To learn about all the ways the students can earn points in the areas of Leadership, Character, and Service, you can either pick up the form in the Counseling Center or look at it on-line. Students who earn the award will be honored in a special assembly at the end of the year when they will receive a special certificate. I hope that you will review the requirements with your child and encourage him or her to make the effort required to earn the award.

### STUDENT WILDCAT

Students who are following the 9 pillars of the Wildcat Way can be awarded a Wildcat Card by any staff member. These cards can be turned in to the raffle jar in the Counseling Center. Once a month we will have a raffle drawing which will be broadcast on the Friday Update.

### WILDCAT OF THE MONTH

Each month 5 students will be chosen as "Wildcat of the Month." Students will be nominated for this award by the staff. The principal will choose from these nominations. The winners will be treated to lunch at a nearby restaurant with the principal. Students will receive certificates and be honored in an assembly.

### PICTURE DAY

Please help your child remember that **September 16<sup>th</sup> is school picture day**. Every student will be photographed whether they wish to buy pictures or not. Identification cards, with the student's picture, will be issued that day. These I.D. cards are used as student bus passes for those who ride the school bus. They are also used to check out library books and for identification when picking up yearbooks and entering other school activities. Picture make-up day is October 21<sup>st</sup>.

### WANGENHEIM DISCIPLINE POLICY

The discipline code is in effect whenever a Wangenheim student is on campus **24 hours a day**. The following behaviors are absolutely forbidden at any time and will result in disciplinary action:

- Defiance or disrespect of authority
- Truancy or habitual tardiness
- Classroom defiance or disruption
- Injuring another person
- Sexual harassment or battery
- Possession or use of weapons
- Fighting, play fighting, pushing, shoving
- Possession or use of drugs or alcohol
- Smoking or possession of tobacco products such as cigarettes, lighters or matches
- Extortion or threats
- **Photographing or videotaping on campus without permission**
- **Posting school videos or photographs on the internet**
- Cyber bullying and internet harassment
- Theft or possession of stolen property
- Vandalism including graffiti
- Profanity/rude language, abusive language
- Gambling
- Misbehavior going to or from school
- Loitering on campus after 2:35 pm
- Gum chewing
- Littering
- Selling on campus without permission
- Cheating, plagiarizing, academic dishonesty
- Passing through landscaped areas
- PDA: Public display of affection, including holding hands, hugging and/or kissing
- **Inappropriate Items:** Possession or use of items inappropriate to the educational process, such as poppers, iPods, PSPs, laser pointers, tape recorders, video games, cameras, skateboards, rollerblades, scooters, toys, spray cans, permanent markers, liquid white-out, and trading cards. For the first offense, the item will be returned to the student after the parent signs a warning. For the second offense, the item will only be returned to the parent. Items not retrieved within one week will be discarded. Items for repeat offenders may be confiscated until the end of the school year. Wangenheim is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged items.
